Do Not Let Your Heart Become Hardened

Author and Title

The name "Deuteronomy" derives from the Greek for "second Torah," an early mistranslation of "copy of this law" in 17:18. In fact, Deuteronomy emphasizes that its laws are not a new law but rather the preaching of the original law given to Israel at Sinai.

Deuteronomy 31:9 records that Moses wrote down "this Torah," most likely referring to chapters 1–30. Certainly the bulk of these chapters is the speech of Moses to Israel in the plains of Moab at the end of the 40-year wilderness period and immediately preceding the conquest under Joshua. Later OT and NT statements also assume Mosaic authorship (cf. Josh. 23:6; 1 Kings 2:3; Mal. 4:4; Matt. 19:7–8; Rom. 10:19).

Structure

There are a number of similarities between the structure of Deuteronomy and ancient treaty documents. In particular, treaties from the Hittites of the second millennium and treaties from the Assyrians of the eighth century B.C. have clear affinities with the structure of Deuteronomy, though each with differences. Though Deuteronomy does not perfectly match the treaties of the Hittites, it is much closer in structure to them than to the later Assyrian treaties.

A simple summary of the treaty structure, with Deuteronomy's verses, is shown on the chart.



The Setting of Deuteronomy

c. 1406/1220 B.C.

The book of Deuteronomy recounts Moses' words to the Israelites as they waited on the plains of Moab to enter Canaan. Moses begins by reviewing the events of Israel's journey from Mount Sinai (or Mount Horeb) to the plains of Moab.

Israel's Refusal to Enter the Land

(Deu 1:19 TLV) "**Then we journeyed** from Horeb and went through all that great and terrible wilderness that you saw on the way to the hill country of the Amorites, as Adonai our YHVH Elohim commanded us. Then we came to Kadesh-barnea.

(Deu 1:20 TLV) I said to you: 'You have come to the hill country of the Amorites, which Adonai our YHVH Elohim is giving to us.

(Deu 1:21 TLV) See, Adonai your YHVH Elohim has set the land before you—go up, take possession, as Adonai YHVH Elohim of your fathers has promised you. **Do not be afraid or discouraged**.'

(Deu 1:22 TLV) Then all of you came near to me and said: 'Let's send men ahead of us to explore the land for us and bring us back word about the way we should go up and the cities we will enter.'

- (Deu 1:29 TLV) "Then I said to you, 'Don't tremble or be afraid of them.
- (Deu 1:30 TLV) Adonai your YHVH Elohim, who goes before you, He Himself will fight for you—just as He did for you in Egypt before your own eyes,
- (Deu 1:31 TLV) and in the wilderness, where you saw **how Adonai your YHVH Elohim** carried you as a man carries his son, everywhere you went until you came to this place.'

Fear Not YHVH Elohim is with you

#3 (Deu 1:29 TLV) "Then I said to you, 'Don't tremble or be afraid of them.

(Deu 1:30 TLV) **Adonai your YHVH Elohim, who goes before you, He Himself will fight for you**—just as He did for you in Egypt before your own eyes,

(Deu 1:31 TLV) and in the wilderness, where you saw **how Adonai your YHVH Elohim** carried you as a man carries his son, everywhere you went until you came to this place.'

1:29–31 Do not be ... afraid. See v. 21. This exhortation is grounded in past experience of the plagues and the exodus from **Egypt** (see Exodus 7–14) and the **wilderness** provision (see also Deut. 1:33). **before your eyes ... you have seen**. Even though this is the next generation (see note on vv. 20–21), Moses sees the nation as a unity and addresses his audience as though they were there with the previous generation. **carried you, as a man carries his son**. The image is tender and loving, repudiating the false claim of v. 27.⁴

We are to Trust Adonai completely

(Deu 1:32 TLV) Yet for all this you did not trust in Adonai your YHVH Elohim—

1:32 The people's unbelief (see Numbers 14) contrasts with faith for entering YHVH Elohim's rest (Heb. 3:7–4:11).⁵

(Heb 3:7 NASB) Therefore, just as the Ruach HaKodesh says, "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE,

(Heb 3:8 NASB) DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS AS WHEN THEY PROVOKED ME, AS IN THE DAY OF TRIAL IN THE WILDERNESS,

(Heb 3:9 NASB) WHERE YOUR FATHERS TRIED *Me* BY TESTING *Me*, AND SAW MY WORKS FOR FORTY YEARS.

(Heb 3:10 NASB) "THEREFORE I WAS ANGRY WITH THIS GENERATION, AND SAID, 'THEY ALWAYS GO ASTRAY IN THEIR HEART, AND THEY DID NOT KNOW MY WAYS':

(Heb 3:11 NASB) AS I SWORE IN MY WRATH, 'THEY SHALL NOT ENTER MY REST.'"

(Heb 3:12 NASB) Take care, brethren, that there not be in any one of you an evil, unbelieving heart that falls away from the living YHVH Elohim.

(Heb 3:13 NASB) But encourage one another day after day, as long as it is *still* called "Today," so that none of you will be hardened by the deceitfulness of sin.

(Heb 3:15 NASB) while it is said, "TODAY IF YOU HEAR HIS VOICE, DO NOT HARDEN YOUR HEARTS, AS WHEN THEY PROVOKED ME."

(Heb 3:18 NASB) And to whom did He swear that they would not enter His rest, but to those who were disobedient?

(Heb 3:19 NASB) So we see that they were not able to enter because of unbelief.

(Heb 4:1 TLV) Let us fear then! Though a promise of entering His rest is left open, some of you would seem to have fallen short.

(Heb 4:2 TLV) For we also have had Good News proclaimed to us, just as they did. But the word they heard did not help them, because they were not unified with those who listened in faith.

(Heb 4:3 TLV) **For we who have trusted are entering into that rest**. It is just as YHVH Elohim has said, "So in My wrath I swore, 'They shall never enter My rest," even though His works were finished since the foundation of the world.

(Heb 4:4 TLV) For somewhere He has spoken about the seventh day in this way: "And YHVH Elohim rested on the seventh day from all His works,"

(Heb 4:5 TLV) and again in this passage: "They shall never enter My rest."

(Heb 4:6 TLV) So then it remains for some to enter into it; yet those who formerly had Good News proclaimed to them did not enter because of disobedience.

(Heb 4:7 TLV) Again, YHVH Elohim appoints a certain day—"Today"—saying through David after so long a time, just as it has been said before, "**Today, if you hear His voice, do not harden your hearts.**"

(Heb 4:8 TLV) For if Joshua had given them rest, YHVH Elohim would not have spoken of another day later on.

(Heb 4:9 TLV) So there remains a Shabbat rest for the people of YHVH Elohim.

(Heb 4:10 TLV) For the one who has entered YHVH Elohim's rest has also ceased from his own work, just as YHVH Elohim did from His.

(Heb 4:11 TLV) Let us, therefore, **make every effort to enter that rest**, so that no one may fall through the same pattern of disobedience.

A Shabbat-keeping, Greek sabbatismos, used only here in the New Testament. In the Septuagint, the related Greek word "sabbatizein" was coined to translate the Hebrew verb shabat when it means "to observe Shabbat." The usual translation, "There remains a Sabbath rest," minimizes the observance aspect and makes the role of YHVH Elohim's people entirely passive.

Christians often assume that the New Testament does not require YHVH Elohim's people to observe *Shabbat* and go on to claim that Sunday has replaced Saturday as the Church's day of worship (see 1C 16:2N). But this passage, and in particular v. 9, shows that *Shabbat*-observance is expected of believers. From Co 2:16–17, which says that *Shabbat* was a shadow of the things that were to come, but the substance comes from the Messiah, we learn that the essence of *Shabbat*-observance for believers is not following the detailed rules which *halakhah* sets forth concerning what may or may not be done on the seventh day of the week. Rather, as v. 10 explains, the *Shabbat*-keeping expected of

YHVH Elohim's people consists in resting from one's **own works**, as YHVH Elohim **did from his**; it consists in trusting and being faithful to YHVH Elohim (vv. 2–3). Although the specific "works" from which the readers of this letter were to rest were animal sacrifices (see 6:4–6), by implication all self-struggle, in which one relies on one's own efforts instead of trusting YHVH Elohim, is to be avoided; and in this the author is making the same point as Sha'ul does at Ro 3:19–4:25. ⁶

(Heb 4:12 TLV) For the word of YHVH Elohim is living and active and sharper than any two-edged sword—piercing right through to a separation of soul and spirit, joints and marrow, and able to judge the thoughts and intentions of the heart.

(Heb 4:13 TLV) No creature is hidden from Him, but all are naked and exposed to the eyes of Him to whom we must give account.

See, the Word of YHVH Elohim is alive! The Bible does not merely speak in the dead tones of the past but applies living truth to the people of "Today" (3:7&N). When we read the Word of YHVH Elohim with an open heart, mind and spirit, we let YHVH Elohim penetrate deeply into our lives. The inner reflections and attitudes of the heart quickly come under judgment against the standards of Scripture; and there is no hope for us apart from entering YHVH Elohim's rest, trusting in the *cohen hagadol* whom YHVH Elohim has provided to intercede for us (7:25&N), and holding firmly to what we acknowledge as true.

But the Word of YHVH Elohim is also Yeshua the Messiah (Yn 1:1&N, 14&N). When he returns to conquer the wicked at the End of Days, "he is called **the Word of YHVH Elohim**, ... and out of his mouth comes a sharp **sword**"; while **the eyes of him to whom we must render an account** are described as "like a fiery flame" (Rv 19:11–15). Actually, our account is rendered to YHVH Elohim, but YHVH Elohim has committed all judgment to Yeshua (Yn 5:22, Ac 17:31, Ro 2:16). ⁷

From your mouth to YHVH Elohim's ears!

(Deu 1:34 TLV) "When Adonai heard the tone of your words, He was angry and swore an oath saying,

(Deu 1:35 TLV) 'Not one of these men of this evil generation will see the good land that I swore to give your fathers—

(Pro 12:13 TLV) An evil one is **ensnared by the sin of lips**, but the righteous one escapes trouble.

(Pro 12:14 TLV) By the fruit of his mouth a man will be satisfied with good. The work of a man's hands will reward him.

(Mal 3:16 TLV) Then those who revere Adonai spoke with each other, and Adonai took notice and heard, and a scroll of remembrance was written before Him, for those who revere Adonai, even those who esteem His Name.

(Mal 3:17 TLV) "So they shall be Mine,"—says Adonai-Tzva'ot—" in the day I make My own special possession. So I will spare them, as one spares his son serving him.

(Mal 3:18 TLV) Then you will return and distinguish between the righteous and the wicked, between one who serves YHVH Elohim and one who does not serve Him."

(Mal 3:19 TLV) "For behold, the day is coming—it will burn like a furnace—when all the proud and every evildoer will become stubble. The day that is coming will set them ablaze"—says Adonai-Tzva'ot—"leaving them neither root nor branch."

Haftarah – YHVH Elohim's Mercy upon Judah after their Rebellion

(Isa 1:2 TLV) Listen! Heavens, and hear, earth, for Adonai has spoken: "Sons I have raised and brought up, **but they have rebelled against Me.**

(Isa 1:3 TLV) The ox knows its owner, and the donkey its manger, **but Israel does not know, My people do not understand.**"

(Isa 1:4 TLV) Oy, a sinful nation, a people weighed down with iniquity, offspring of evildoers, sons dealing corruptly! They have abandoned Adonai. **They have despised Israel's Holy One. They have turned backwards.**

(Isa 1:5 TLV) Where will you be struck again, as you stray away more and more? **The whole head is sick, the whole heart faint.**

(Isa 1:6 TLV) From the foot to the head there is no soundness. Wounds, bruises and raw sores: not pressed, nor bandaged, nor softened with oil.

- (Isa 1:13 TLV) Bring no more worthless offerings! Incense is an abomination to Me. New Moon and Shabbat, the calling of convocations—I cannot endure it—iniquity with solemn assembly.
- (Isa 1:14 TLV) Your New Moons and your Festivals My soul hates! They are a burden to Me. I am weary to bear them.
- (Isa 1:15 TLV) When you spread out your hands, I will hide My eyes from you. When you multiply prayers, I will not hear. Your hands are full of blood!"
- (Isa 1:16 TLV) Wash and make yourselves clean. Put away the evil of your deeds from before My eyes. Cease to do evil.
- (Isa 1:17 TLV) Learn to do good, seek justice, relieve the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow."
- (Isa 1:18 TLV) "Come now, let us reason together," says Adonai. "Though your sins be like scarlet, they will be as white as snow. Though they be red like crimson, they will become like wool.
- (Isa 1:19 TLV) If you are willing and obey, you will eat the good of the land.
- (Isa 1:20 TLV) **But if you refuse and rebel, you will be devoured with the sword**." For the mouth of Adonai has spoken.
- (Isa 1:21 TLV) How the Faithful City became a harlot! She once was full of justice, righteousness lodged in her—but now murderers!
- (Isa 1:22 TLV) Your silver has become dross, your wine diluted by water.
- (Isa 1:23 TLV) Your princes are rebellious and friends with thieves. Everyone loves a bribe and chases after rewards. They do not defend the orphan, nor does a widow's case come to them.
- (Isa 1:24 TLV) Therefore says the Lord Adonai-Tzva'ot, the Mighty One of Israel: "Oy! I will get relief from My foes and avenge Myself on My enemies.
- (Isa 1:25 TLV) Then I will turn My hand on you, purge away your dross, and remove all your alloy.
- (Isa 1:26 TLV) I will restore your judges as at first, your counselors as at the start. Afterward you will be called City of Righteousness, Faithful City.
- (Isa 1:27 TLV) Zion will be redeemed with justice, her repentant with righteousness."
