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Our Bad Decisions Have Consequences

Parshah Overview:

Jacob returns to the Holy Land after a 20-year stay in Charan, and sends angel-emissaries to **Esau** in hope of a reconciliation, but his messengers report that his brother is on the warpath with 400 armed men. Jacob prepares for **war**, **prays**, and sends Esau a large **gift** (consisting of hundreds of heads of livestock) to appease him.

That night, Jacob ferries his family and possessions across the Jabbok River; he, however, remains behind and encounters the angel that embodies **the spirit of Esau**, with whom he wrestles until daybreak. Jacob suffers a dislocated hip but vanquishes the supernal creature, who bestows on him the name **Israel**, which means “he who prevails over the divine.”

Jacob and Esau meet, embrace and **kiss**, but part ways. Jacob purchases a plot of land near **Shechem**, whose crown prince—also called Shechem—abducts and rapes Jacob’s daughter **Dinah**. Dinah’s brothers **Simeon and Levi** avenge the deed by killing all male inhabitants of the city, after rendering them vulnerable by convincing them to circumcise themselves.

Jacob journeys on. **Rachel** dies while giving birth to her second son, **Benjamin**, and is buried in a roadside grave near Bethlehem. **Reuben** loses the birthright because he interferes with his father’s marital life. Jacob arrives in **Hebron**, to his father Isaac, who later dies at age 180. (Rebecca has passed away before Jacob’s arrival.)

Our Parshah concludes with a detailed account of Esau’s wives, children and grandchildren; the family histories of the people of **Seir**, among whom Esau settled; and a list of the **eight kings** who ruled Edom, the land of Esau’s and Seir’s descendants.¹

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The Story of Dinah;

Gen 34:1 Now Dinah, Leah's daughter whom she bore for Jacob, went out to look at the daughters of the land.

Gen 34:2 When Shechem the son of Hamor the Hivite, the prince of the land, saw her, he took her and lay with her and raped her.

Gen 34:3 But his soul clung to Dinah, Jacob's daughter, and he loved the young woman and spoke reassuringly to the young woman.

Gen 34:4 So Shechem said to his father Hamor saying, "Get me this girl for a wife."

Gen 34:5 Now Jacob had heard that he had defiled his daughter Dinah while his sons were with his livestock in the field, so Jacob kept quiet until they came in.

Gen 34:6 Meanwhile Shechem's father Hamor went out to Jacob in order to speak with him.

Gen 34:7 Jacob's sons had already come in from the field when they heard, and the men were deeply grieved and furious, because he had committed a vile deed in Israel by lying with Jacob's daughter, which ought never to be done.

Gen 34:8 But Hamor spoke with them saying, "My son Shechem—he's very attached to your daughter. Please give her to him for a wife.

Gen 34:9 Intermarry with us. You can give your daughters to us, and you can take our daughters for yourselves.

Gen 34:10 You can live with us, and the land will be open to you: live in it, move about freely in it, and settle down in it."

Gen 34:11 Shechem also said to her father and to her brothers, "Would that I find favor in your eyes! Whatever you say to me I'll give.

Gen 34:12 Set the dowry and the presents as high as you like and I'll give whatever you say to me. But give me the young woman as a wife."

Gen 34:13 But Jacob's sons answered Shechem and his father Hamor deceitfully as they spoke, because he had defiled their sister Dinah.

Dinah's curiosity about these pagan daughters and their lives got the best of her and she wanders into a situation that will have dire consequences for all involved.

Dinah went to "see".

Here we have an example of how we need to protect what we “see”, look at, regard, learn about, observe, watch etc. the Bible warns us guard our ways. Dinah let her guard down in order to satisfy her curiosity.

Psa 39:1 **For the choir director, for Jeduthun. A Psalm of David.** I said, "I will guard my ways That I may not sin with my tongue; I will guard my mouth as with a muzzle While the wicked are in my presence."

We know that she went unprotected by her brothers into a land that did not follow the ways of Adonai. Shechem sees her and wants her and rapes her and causes shame and disgrace to come upon her. After the deed is done, he now wants to marry her and his father goes to Jacob to see if a marriage can be arranged.

The brothers are furious over the disgrace that their sister has been put through and in the end exact their revenge upon all the men in the city.

Here we can see how one bad decision can cause deadly consequences.

The Bible tells us, that as believers we are not to have anything to do with those who do not live according to His ways.

2Co 6:14 Do not be unequally yoked with unbelievers. For what partnership has righteousness with lawlessness? Or what fellowship has light with darkness?

Eph 5:11 Take no part in the unfruitful works of darkness, but instead expose them.

If Dinah had stayed where she belonged and had not wandered off into enemy territory, none of this would have happened.

The Bible is silent regarding Dinah after this incident except for **Gen 46:15** These are the sons of Leah, whom she bore to Jacob in Paddan-aram, together with his daughter Dinah; altogether his sons and his daughters numbered thirty-three.

Again, our bad decisions have consequences. Many times we think the grass is greener on the other side, but in reality it is a delusion.

We need to walk in the Wisdom of the Ruach, which will guard and protect us from making bad decisions.

How many times in our lives did we make bad decisions because we failed to ask God for direction and guidance. However, the good news is that God can turn our mourning into dancing and our curses into blessings when we turn back to Him. He is the God of new beginnings!
